#### Investments this month at St Fiacc's

8 air purifiers with HEPA filters and UV lamp to kill any airborne viruses. Placed in the 8 largest classes. Paid for without any school grant. That's why your donations matter! Cost 3k. 8 fully configured i - pads to support learning in mainstream and Learning support. Cost 3.5k.

\*Unfortunately ventilation requirements mean more draughts in classrooms but we are heating classrooms for longer periods with increasing energy costs. Your child may wear a coat/hat in class if they feel cold. They may place a blanket on knees also. Please insist that they wear a good coat to school. The air quality is measured with CO2 monitors. If we close windows the monitor goes red

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indicating poor air quality.

Attendance rate for October – 87.6%. Well done all!

There has been a lot of confusion about the symptoms parents need to be aware of. The public health authorities ask parents not to send their child to school if they are experiencing any of the following symptoms:

- Fever (38°+) New cough Shortness of breath
- **!** Loss/change of smell/taste Fatigue Aches/pains
  - Sore throat Headache Feeling sick Diarrhoea

Or with any of the above symptoms and a runny/stuffy nose.
