- 1 parent is engaged on a weekly basis with the school library after year 1.
- 15 target parents engaged in HSCL activities in year 1.
- 10 parents participated in English language classes in year 1.
- 92.9% of parents engaged with Aladdin Connect in year 1
- 70% (51/73) of parents engaged often (2-4 times per week) on Seesaw in Junior Infants in year 1.
- 4 parents participated in a focus group to draft an EAL policy in June, Year 1.
