#### 1. Introduction and Overview

St Fiaccs NS is a co-educational urban catholic school serving the Graiguecullen community. The school's enrolment presently stands at 589 pupils. To date 21 Ukrainian pupils have enrolled at St. Fiacc's. St. Fiacc's has 34 teachers comprising of an administrative Principal, 22 class teachers, 1 HSCL teacher and 10 Special Educational Needs teachers. It shares 5 SET hours with Levitstown NS. It presently has 25 additional EAL teacher hours for Ukrainian pupils and a projected enrolment post. Mr John Brennan is the Principal of St Fiacc's, Mr Pauric Bolton is Deputy Principal. In addition the school has one Assistant Principal 1 post holders and five Assistant Principal 11 post holders. The school will fill an extra AP1 and AP2 post this year. St Fiacc's has four Special Needs Assistants; a caretaker, three cleaners and a secretary. Our Deputy Miss Mary Fleming retired this year after 35 year's service at St. Fiacc's.

On 9/03/2022 St. Fiacc's was recognised as a DEIS Band II School. This will result in increased funding for our school to achieve educational outcomes for our pupils in line with national norms. To date Miss Fiona Payne has been appointed HSCL teacher for a 5 year period.

#### 2. Mission Statement

Our school embodies Christian, Catholic values which emphasises compassion, care, good work ethos, striving for excellence and respect for all, irrespective of race, religion or social status.

The Board met 7 times this year. John Brennan underwent training on Child Protection. Mr Brennan also completed a graduate Diploma in Life and Leadership Coaching and a Certificate in Professional Coaching Practice and Ethics, part funded by the Board of Management.

**Educational Projects** 

All protocols outlined in the Covid 19 Response plan and Covid Risk Assessment were adhered to. The BOM wishes to acknowledge the excellent work of the staff of St. Fiacc's in ensuring a safe working environment for both staff and pupils. The school has changed its opening times from 9.20 - 3pm to 9.10 - 2.50pm.

St. Fiacc's ran a Summer Inclusion programme for pupils with additional needs and pupils of disadvantage for two weeks from July 4th - July 15th. 36 pupils participated in the Programme. St. Fiacc's also ran a DEIS Literacy and Numeracy Camp for one week from July 11th - July 15th for 36 pupils.

#### Extra curricular activities and School Celebrations

Extra curricular activities were curtailed due to Covid 19 restrictions but many returned in Term Three 2022. We hope that September 2022 will see a return to many extra curricular activities including: Gaelic Football; Soccer; Basketball; athletics; debating; Student Council; Greenschools; Active schools; Irish Dancing; Tag Rugby. Unfortunately our Hall is occupied with SEN spaces due to accommodation shortages.

#### Living Our Ethos

Mr Pauric Bolton is responsible for Coordinating Religious Instruction Policy at St. Fiacc's and assisting with school mass preparation. Mr Bolton attended Flourish training 28/09/2021. Fr Dunphy, our school Chaplin, visits the school regularly and supports all pupils in their faith formation. School and class masses are held regularly to promote the school ethos and to celebrate liturgical events The parish centre is proactive in Sacramental preparation and prepares both pupils and their families in their understanding of Confirmation, Penance and Eucharist . Prayer is a feature of school life both in class and at Friday Assemblies where designated classes lead the school in prayer and arrange thematic displays monthly in

our school reception. The Liturgical seasons were celebrated during weekly school assemblies along the following themes:

Oct Assembly Theme - The Rosary.

November Assembly Theme - In November We Remember;

December Assembly Theme- Advent.

January: Catholic Schools Week; Our Lady of Lourdes

February: St. Brigid; Lent

March: St. Patrick April: Easter May: Our Lady

June: The Sacred Heart
